PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

2018

2018 has proven to be both an exciting and challenging time for the Mel Maria Catholic School community.

As I reflect though upon the year I feel extremely grateful for the many blessings we have received and proud of what we have achieved.

Religious Education

2018 has seen our community grow and flourish in Faith. Religious Education is our first domain of learning at Mel Maria, and our students continue to have access to high quality teaching of Religious Education and Faith formation experiences.

Results in the recent Bishops Religious Literacy Test for Year 3 and 5 indicate our students are performing well above the state average.

Our children's close relationship with Parish on each campus plays a significant role in the lives of our students and their families. We are committed to fostering this close relationship.

Celebrating the Eucharist is an important part of what makes a school a Catholic school. The Eucharist is a memorial celebration of the life, death and resurrection of Jesus and as such is the "summit and source" of the Church's life and mission. Our parish Priests Fr. Sean Fernandez, Fr. Don Kettle, Fr. Joseph Lee and Deacon John Kiely celebrate mass regularly with our school classes and community. I thank them for being present in our school and for their availability, pastoral guidance friendship and support.

The school is seriously committed to supporting Parish based Sacramental Programs, which are a central feature of preparation for our students. All sacramental years participate in Retreat days providing reflection and formation experiences for our students.

Parent and Child workshops are important events which recognise parents as the first educators in faith for the children, supported by parish and school.

Mel Maria continues to flourish and is guided by strong principles of social justice. Our attention and service to Catholic charities is embedded within our school and liturgical year. Students are involved in fundraising and awareness raising experiences, which demonstrate how direct action and community co-responsibility can effect change. Our Parents and Friends group support and collaborate with parents during such events. Charities such as

Caritas, Life Link, Saint Vincent De Paul and Saint Patricks in Fremantle are some of the recipients of our successful work.



Achievements

Each year staff examine various sources of data (NAPLAN, school climate data, QCS findings and school assessments) to determine a curriculum focus for the following year. At the conclusion of 2017 we identified the need to focus on WRITING and implemented the BrightPaths Program into the Curriculum. We continued with Brightpaths in 2018 noting a general improvement in outcomes in Writing.

BRIGHTPATHS is based on over a decade of pioneering research at the University of Western Australia. The program records the results of assessments and reports a range of formative and summative information to teachers and principals. This provides an informed basis for developing teaching programs targeting the needs of individual students. Teachers match their students' work with calibrated exemplars and can track student growth over time, compare performances across year levels and provide comparative information of performance with that of other schools.

We will continue to use Brightpath data to develop and extend children's writing skills in the new year. In 2019, our Curriculum focus will be BUILDING VOCABULARY and WRITING skills. Our aim is to continue to develop children's writing skills and to build upon vocabulary to enhance overall literacy skills.

At Mel Maria we recognize the importance of early intervention. As such we offer Speech and Occupational Therapy screening in our Kindergarten and Pre Primary classes. Our Early Intervention Literacy Program, a vital element in identifying children with literacy concerns, has again proven extremely successful.

In summary our **Literacy and Numeracy** results have been very pleasing indeed. Thanks to Mrs Laura Morgan, our Assistant Principals Mrs Ros Nichols and Mrs Joanne Scouler for their unending commitment in overseeing this area of our curriculum.

Technology

Our technology environment has continually grown and developed in 2018. As part of LEADing Lights, all staff and students in years 4 -6 are now utilizing Office 365.

This year the device used in our one to one program for years 4 and 5 was changed to an apple laptop.

To assist parents with our one to one program we have partnered with Family Zone – a leading cyber safety company. Parents of students in years four – six now have the opportunity to install cyber safety software on their child's device. This has enabled parents to monitor internet use at home ensuring their child have access to appropriate apps and content when online. The school has also been trialing "School Zone" an additional safety filter. More than 600 schools in Australia, New Zealand and America use the product. The mandated Bishops internet filtering system is also in operation. With the added filters of School Zone, we have been able to extend the protection offered to our students at a higher level when online. Our goals is to assist students to become safe, responsible citizens within the technological world.

This year all year three and five students completed the Bishops Religious Literacy assessment online. Year 3 students trialed a NAPLAN online readiness test. Next year, as per the directive from the Catholic Education Office, all Year three and five students will complete NAPLAN online

STEAM – Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics

In 2018 a formalized scope and sequence was developed to embed a technology skill base across the curriculum from Pre Primary to Year 6.

Every child will be presented with the opportunity to have hands on experiences, with a variety of technologies utilizing contemporary learning skills.

By the end of Year 6 all students would have used Bee Bots, STEM kits, Spheros, Animation using iStopMotion, imovie, coding, robotics and virtual reality sets.

Students will build their skill set over their time at Mel Maria and engage each child in futuristic learning.

Such experiences are invaluable and of great benefit to our children thanks to Mr Roman Popadynec, Mrs Teresa Marra, Mr Damian Williams and the various classroom teachers.

Music, Dance and Drama

Our children continue to enjoy their love of music; dance and drama as pleasing results were again achieved in the *Performing Arts Festival for Catholic Schools*.

Mel Maria was presented with many Honourable Mentions and Certificates of Merit – an outstanding achievement.

An exciting component of the year 5 and 6 music program has been their exploration of "Garage Band" music recording software.

Our year 4 classes formed "bands", combining singing, dancing, ukulele, guitar, xylophone, djembe and drums to showcase their efforts during "Open Night".

A range of instrumental tutors visits each campus enabling children to learn piano, guitar, singing and percussion.

Our School Choir performed at various functions and gatherings on numerous occasions. We extend our appreciation to Mr Luke Murphy and Mrs Genevieve Sumich for sharing their love of music and talent with the children.

Sport

As always, Sport featured prominently on the Mel Maria school calendar. Numerous opportunities were provided for our students to show their talents and involvement in the sporting arena.

Before school swimming training was again well supported with huge numbers of students attending training sessions to prepare for trials and carnivals. A number of staff were involved in Running Club at both campuses on a Friday morning; thanks to Andy Carr, Bianca Sangalli, Jacob Rees, Damian Williams, Judy Shales and Elizabeth Pell for their help. Across our various trials days, Faction Carnivals and Interschool Carnivals there were also numerous parents who helped with an array of jobs – thank you for your ongoing support!

Gold surged back to win their second Swimming Carnival in three years, and also managed to break Blue Faction's stranglehold on the Cross Country title. Blue did manage to win the Sports Day. Students involved in these carnivals showed great sportsmanship and great competitive spirit, which has become a hallmark of Mel Maria sporting events.

It was another strong year of interschool performances this year, despite dropping slightly in Athletics and Swimming where we finished in fourth position out of eight schools in 'A' Division. Our yearly improvement in cross country continued, with a second placing our best result this decade. We performed strongly again in the Year 6 Winter Sports Carnival, winning most of our games and enjoying the day despite the threat of nasty weather. Thank you to all staff and parents who helped at these carnivals and also in the lead up to the events.

Our appreciation is extended to our Sports Teacher, Mr David John, Mr Damian Williams and staff for overseeing these events.

Library Resource Centre

The highlight in the Library for 2018 was the visit by the *Australian Children's Laureate* 2017-2018 Leigh Hobbs. He spent the day at Mel Maria visiting both campuses. Leigh Hobbs encouraged the children to write down their stories, he shared a variety of drawing tips and spoke about how he creates his illustrations. Leigh Hobbs was a hit with staff and students as he relayed his experiences while being the ambassador for children's literature for 2017-2018.

The *Library Webpage* is regularly updated providing the children with a safe and relevant starting point for their online research.

Curated resources are regularly added so the children can easily and securely access quality information and reliable resources at school and from home.

With the growing collection and increased use of the library our parent helpers are relied upon even more to provide assistance with the covering of both reading and library books, along with shelving resources, assisting with incursions and end of year cleaning tasks. A big thank you to all the parents who provide this assistance throughout the year.

Planned literacy activities included our Year 1's visiting the State Library of WA for a wonderful *Fun with Fairy Tales* excursion. The SLWA provides the perfect venue for the Year 1 children to experience the joy of Fairy Tales in this wonderful public space.

The annual *Better Beginnings* promotion for Kindergarten in conjunction with the Melville Public Library is always the perfect introduction into children's literature. Each child received a book pack with reading suggesting and story ideas for parents and a delightful picture book to add to their personal library.

Library & Information Week was celebrated in May with a theme of 'Find yourself in a Library'. During this week of national celebration for all libraries the Mel Maria children participated in the annual National Simultaneous Storytime Event which showcased the story- Hickory Dickory Dash by Tony Wilson.

In August *The Children's Bookweek* author/illustrator sessions were held across a variety of Melville Council venues. The 2018 theme was *Find your Treasure* with a continued emphasis on science. The children had the opportunity meet various authors, illustrators and storytellers

Mel Maria Library works closely with the Fremantle Literature Centre, Melville City Council Library and the State Library of WA to promote good literature through Australian authors and illustrators.

Two *Professional Learning* opportunities were organized by the Library- Dr Margaret Merga from Curtin University shared her research on the importance of reading for pleasure for our mental health, debunked a few myths about boys and reading, while also reminding us of the long term benefits for our spoken and written language which flows onto academic achievement. This event was followed by a presentation from The Fremantle Literature Centre on Picture Books and Oral Language. Both events provided concrete material for teachers to use in the classrooms.

It is the aim of the library to provide a safe haven for the children to read, borrow, relax and just enjoy the space while developing their love of reading

For the 4th year in a row Mel Maria hosted an *Indigenous Literacy Foundation Book Swap* during *Bookweek*. With the help and support of parents this event gave the children the opportunity to read and share books donated by the students themselves. It is also a pertinent reminder to help those less fortunate than ourselves. The Bookswap has become an annual event in our Library calendar.

Over 1400 new items were processed in 2018 along with subscriptions to World Book Online Encyclopedia and Britannica Online. The emphasis for 2018 has been updating our Fiction resources and with *Laudato Si'* a focus on resources on sustainability which will continue into 2019.

An ongoing review of our Aboriginal resources across the curriculum and the successful submission for funding allowed us to purchase recycled *Yarning Mats* for each cluster area across both sites. This connects with the school focus on writing and storytelling.

A warm welcome to our Library Officer Dawn Plester who joined the library team at the start of the year. Also, a huge thank you to both Dawn and Greta Scheggia for creating engaging displays all year round often at a moment's notice. The students are always keen to see what is new and on display when they visit the Library. These displays help the children connect with what is happening in their community and the world around them.

Our utmost appreciation is extended to Elizabeth Martini and Megan Cooper for providing our children with such a rich and meaningful learning environment.

It is encouraging to see an ever-increasing number of children visiting the library before and after school as well as at lunchtime to read, borrow, relax and just enjoy the space and appealing environment.

In order to meet the diverse needs of our children and indeed to challenge them the school provides additional services and opportunities.

Support

This year approximately 123 children received extra assistance from our Support team in the Numeracy area and 90 in Literacy.

Our support staff are trained in identifying and responding to children's specific learning needs via the ongoing monitoring and assessment of student progress. Teaching strategies such as a Differentiated Teaching approach and focused intensive teaching one on one and in small groups are regularly practiced.

Support staff liase with Students with Disabilities' consultants from the Catholic Education Office, organize IEP meetings (Individual Education Plans) and maintain contact with parents, teachers and specialists' practitioners such as Speech Pathologists, Behavioural Optometrists, Occupational Therapists, Psychologists and Audiologists. This year approximately 55 children were referred to such professionals.

Assessment programs include: YARK (Yok Assessment of Reading Comprehension), Magic Boxes Assessment, Mathematics Assessment Interviews (MAI's) and PAT Reading, Spelling, Mathematics and Vocabulary Assessments as well as Speech Screening in Pre- Primary.

Support programs used at Mel Maria include: Repeated Reading, Minilit, Multilit, Spelling Mastery Program and Sounds Write Program. Support for Mathematics is based on EMU principles (Extending Mathematical Understanding) program developed by the Australian Catholic University.

We extend our appreciation to Mrs Joanne Ciccarelli, Mrs Pierina Monaco, Mrs Laura Morgan, Ms Tonya Blair, Ms Lisa Evans, Mrs Christina O'Callaghan and our Assistant Principals, Mrs Ros Nichols and Mrs Joanne Scouler for their time, dedication, patience and care afforded to the children in this program.

Students Exceeding and Excelling in Developmental Skills

SEEDS our Academic Extension Program caters to the gifted and talented students from years one to six. It offers multi- aged groups across both campuses opportunities to engage with like-minded peers and be challenged. It is critical and creative thinking at its best.

It offers multi-aged groups across both campuses the opportunities to engage in programs that challenge: FUTURE PROBLEM SOLVING, MAG SEEDS, SEEDLINGS, PHILOSOPHY, ART,

TOURNAMENT OF THE MIND , YOUNG INNOVATORS, WOW SEEDS and many State and National Competitions.

Helen Smith received a highly commended in the Tim Winton writing competition for her piece entitled "Floating on Air". It is the fourth consecutive year we have had students in the top 10 finalists for this competition that has over 1200 entrants.

MATHS OLYMPIAD – We had 30 students participate in this National competition with four children achieving in the top 20% and Anika Zammit receiving a trophy for ranking in the top 10% in Australia.

TOURNAMENT OF THE MIND- The PN TOM SEEDS team were one of three schools out of 72 invited to attend the West Australian State Final, held on Sunday 9th September 2018 at ECU, Joondalup where they completed a three hour long in challenge. They were awarded with team 'Honours' medals being in the top 10% in the State.

Our appreciation is extended to Mrs Teresa Marra and Mr Roman Popadynec for conducting these challenging programs with our children.

Social Worker

Our Social Worker Mrs. Christine Pittman has again this year provided a vital service assisting students, teachers and parents with the management of numerous issues around children's wellbeing. These include friendship difficulties, dealing with emotions, peer relations, grief/loss, stepfamilies, parental separation, anxiety, conflict resolution and transition management.

She has presented vital information on a range of topics to staff, provided regular items for the school newsletter, worked with teachers and parents regarding individual students' concerns and conducted social skills sessions with classes of various levels. Christine runs the "Rainbows" loss and grief program, has introduced lunchtime activities to promote socializing among children, assisted teachers with implementing the new "Keeping Safe" child protection curriculum and a new social emotional program called "Highway Heroes"

Christine continually emphasizes the school's focus on the holistic wellbeing of our children and their families.

Japanese

2018 marks the 20 year anniversary of the Japanese language program at Mel Maria Catholic Primary School.

In 1997 parents at the time were surveyed and in consultation with the school board, Japanese was chosen as the preferred language. In 1998, Mrs Cate O'Connor was appointed to introduce the language program and it continues successfully to this day.

2018 is also a significant year as our Japanese language program has now becoming aligned with the Western Australian Curriculum. All programming, assessing and reporting is according to the requirements of SCSA (School Curriculum and Standards Authority).

The Japanese program at Mel Maria provides the children with a well- balanced program of language and culture. After four years of lessons, our Year 6 students graduate being able to read, write and speak in Japanese. I am sure you will agree that this is an incredible accomplishment for our students.

In addition to learning the Japanese language, students from Year 3-6 are immersed in Japanese culture. From dressing up in kimonos, using tea sets and making origami in the younger years, to doing creating art work, doing origami workshops and excursions in the older years; everyone is engaged in Japanese culture.

The Japanese language program is a great success, largely due to our enthusiastic and engaged students.

Staff

Aside from parents there is no other group that has a greater influence upon the overall education of your children than our staff. I congratulate them all on their dedication, sheer hard work, care and love afforded to our children. They are an exceptional group of educators of the highest calibre as reflected in the numerous messages of affirmation from parents. The quality programs offered at the school reflect upon their commitment!

All teaching staff are registered with the Western Australian Teachers Registration Board and hold the appropriate tertiary qualifications and level of Accreditation as required by the Catholic Education Commission of Western Australia.

The retention rate of staff from 2017 to 2018 is 96 % and the rate of attendance is 98 %, which reflects their commitment to the children of Mel Maria.

Our non-teaching staff are also well qualified and experienced to undertake the vital roles assigned to them.
