




## **Holy Week**


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## \$100+ raised from Year 5 PN Young Vinnies

# **Our History**

# Mel Maria was established in 1973 by the rationalisation of:

St Joseph Pignatelli Catholic Primary School, Attadale, Corpus Christi Catholic Primary School, Myaree, Our Lady Queen of Peace Catholic Primary School, Willagee and the Primary School of Santa Maria.

All of these schools existed separately in their own right, however because of their size and their limited resources they struggled from an educational perspective to meet curriculum requirements.

Following a series of meetings in 1972 involving the community of each of the schools it was decided to amalgamate all the schools and Mel Maria came into being.

Mel Maria today is a tribute to the wisdom and the foresight of the then Principal of Corpus Christi, Myaree -Sr. Joan Smith. Though she never worked as such at Mel Maria she will always be remembered for her work in sowing the seeds from which Mel Maria has grown and blossoms today. The founding Principal of Mel Maria was Sr. Florence O'Sullivan.





#### Did you Know?

The name Mel Maria was chosen because all three campuses are in the City of Melville. "Mel" comes from the first three letters of Melville and also has Irish derivation meaning "place". "Maria" comes from the link with Santa Maria. The McAuley campus was originally the Primary School of Santa Maria. **So Mel Maria means basically "the place of Mary"**. The patroness of Mel Maria is Our Lady of Mercy

and her feast is celebrated on September 24th.

# **Applying Parental Controls on an iPad**

iPads come with inbuilt Content & Privacy Restrictions. Using the 'Screen Time' option in 'Settings' parents can;

- Block their child from accessing specific websites, apps or functions (like using a device's camera, or the ability to buy things).
- Filter different kinds of content, such as 'adult' content, content that may promote self-harm, eating disorders, violence, drugs, gambling, racism and terrorism.
- Monitor their child's use of connected devices, with reports on the sites they visit and the apps they use, how often and for how long.
- Set time limits, blocking access after a set time.

#### How to Set Content & Privacy Restrictions

- 1. Go to Settings and tap Screen Time.
- 2. Tap Turn on Screen Time, then tap it again. Choose "This is My [Device]" or "This is My Child's [Device]".
  - If you're the parent or guardian of your device and want to prevent another family member from changing your settings, tap Use Screen Time Passcode to create a passcode, then re-enter the passcode to confirm. After you've confirmed your passcode you'll be asked to enter your Apple ID and password. This can be used to reset your Screen Time passcode if you forget it.
  - If you're setting up Screen Time on your child's device, follow the prompts until you get to Screen Time Passcode and enter a passcode. Re-enter the passcode to confirm. After you've confirmed your passcode you'll be asked to enter your Apple ID and password. This can be used to reset your Screen Time passcode if you forget it.
- 3. Tap Content & Privacy Restrictions. If asked, enter your passcode, then turn on Content & Privacy Restrictions.

Make sure you choose a passcode that's different from the passcode you use to unlock your device. With iOS 16, while you're setting up Screen Time for a child's device, you can set age-related restrictions for content in apps, books, TV shows and films. Just follow the onscreen instructions during the setup process.

# **Jamf Parent**

iPads in the school's BYOD program (Years 3 -6) which which have been wiped and setup from the start by the school, have access to Jamf Parent – an app which allows parents to monitor /restrict functions on their child's iPad.

Restrictions can be applied to individual apps or categories of apps. Rules can also be applied to locations set by parents. Parents control their child's iPad by using the Jamf Parent app which is available on the Apple apps store or the Google Play store.

## School age friendships and how to support them



Your child's world gets bigger when they start school. Relationships with other people – like the children in your child's class at school – become more important.

Friendships are good for your school-age child's self esteem. When your child has close friends, your child feels like they belong. Your child's friends care about your child, and this helps your child feel good about themselves.

Friendships also help children develop important life skills like emotional self-regulation, getting along with other people and sorting out conflicts and problems. Children with these skills are less likely to have social and emotional difficulties later in life.
