## PARKING AND DRIVING ETIQUETTE

We ask that parents exercise extreme care and caution when driving in and out of both campuses. Please be considerate at all times when dropping off and picking up. Please do not double-park, or park and leave your vehicle in the drive-through areas or on street verges.

Please observe 'Staff' car park bays and 'Reserved' and 'No Parking' signs on both campuses.

School drop-off and pick-up times are very busy, and we ask that you always be mindful of our neighbours, and practice patience and courtesy to ensure the optimum safety of all our children.

#### PATER NOSTER CAMPUS

- Parents may park inside the school grounds between the church and the school hall – the entry is via Evershed Street.
- Parents may also park in designated parking areas off Evershed Street and North Lake Road.

- It is recommended that Kindy and Pre-Primary parents use the North Lake Road carpark.
- Parents are reminded not to doublepark in the Kiss & Drive zones on Evershed Street. Double parking creates hazards and makes it difficult for traffic to flow.
- Year One to Six families may use the Drive-Through system that operates each afternoon from 2.55pm.

### ST JOSEPH PIGNATELLI

### CAMPUS

- Parents may park near Bourhill Hall located behind the church – the entry is via Wichmann Road near St Joseph Pignatelli Church.
- Parents may also park in the lower carpark – the entry is via Galloway Street in front of the Early Childhood Centre.
- Limited parking is available in designated areas around the school perimeter.

- In the morning, parents may park along Galloway Street and walk their child to the classrooms
- In the afternoon, the setback parking area on Galloway Street is reserved for parents waiting to use the Drive-Through system to collect their child. Parents may not park in this area and leave their vehicle.
- The carpark inside the school grounds on the corner of Davidson & Galloway Streets is reserved for Staff between 8.00am to 4.00pm on school days.
- Please do not park at the top and middle areas of Galloway Street in the afternoons as this is used for Drive-Through.
- Early Childhood parents in the afternoon, parents are requested to avoid using the parking bays on Galloway Street and Davidson Road, but alternatively use the ample parking near Bourhill Hall - the entry is via Wichmann Road near St Joseph Pignatelli Church.

Children must be dropped off and picked up at the classroom door by an adult. If, at any point in time, there is to be a change in your child's routine (eg. if someone other than one of the child's parents is picking up your child, or if you are picking your child up early), please notify us by completing the communication book located in their classroom. Siblings may not pick up children from Pre-Kindy or Kindy.

Please endeavour to arrive on time to pick up your child. We understand that unforeseen circumstances may arise, and if this is the case, please call the school office to advise us.



### **ABSENTEE NOTIFICATION**

If your child is absent from school, please email the class teacher before 8.45am.

A phone call to the school office is acceptable but must be followed up by an email or written note to the teacher.

### **SIGNING IN & OUT**

When a child arrives to school after 9.15am, please ensure the parent/carer signs the child in at the school office. If a child is picked up from school early, please ensure the parent/carer signs the child out at the school office.

### PARENTS & FRIENDS (P&F)

### **ASSOCIATION**

Our school P&F Association is responsible for fundraising to provide teaching aids and amenities, and to encourage parent involvement and creating a sense of community.

The P&F actively supports the work of Catholic Education Western Australia. All parents are members of the P&F Association and your participation in monthly meetings, social and fundraising functions is greatly encouraged and appreciated.

### **PARENT ROSTER**

We encourage, welcome and appreciate all families to be involved at school through rosters and special events. Family helpers share in our planned learning experiences and are engaged in preparation for future activities. It enables you to observe your child in their learning environment and to share in their learning experiences.

It can be more difficult to spend this time with your child if siblings accompany you on roster, so we ask that families please make other arrangements for siblings when they are rostered on.

### **BIRTHDAYS**

Your child will be celebrated in their classroom on their birthday by their class teacher. In addition, to help celebrate your child's birthday, parents are welcome to roster yourself as parent help on or close to your child's special day.

Please do not share sugary treats as part of your child's birthday celebration.

### PARENT-TEACHER INTERVIEWS

Parents are always welcome to visit your child's classroom. Throughout the year, parents are welcome to ask for an interview with the teacher to enquire about their child's learning journey or progress. On some occasions, teachers may request a meeting to discuss your child's progress. All Kindy parents are invited to Parent-Teacher interviews in Term 1 and Term 4.

### **ALLERGY AWARENESS**

We are an 'allergy aware' school. It is important that parents/carers inform the school of a child's allergies and the severity of the allergy (medical forms are available from the school office). Parents must ensure that these forms are updated annually and provided to the school office.

\*Nut allergies - It is difficult for a school to be completely nut-free due to the widespread use of nuts in food production, but every effort is made to minimise the risk of exposure to known allergens.

### MEDICAL CONDITIONS & MEDICATIONS

Parents/carers must inform the school of a child's medical condition (medical forms are available from the school office).

If a child needs medication administered at school, families need to fill in the relevant



medical form available from the school office. All medication, whether prescribed or non-prescribed, must have a pharmacy label with the child's name on it.

#### SUN SAFETY

Please apply sunscreen to your child before they come to school. Please note that our school has a 'NO HAT, NO SUN' policy. Please ensure that your child has a widebrim hat clearly labelled with their name on it that will remain at school.

#### PERSONAL BELONGINGS

The children are asked not to bring in toys or personal belongings except at the teacher's request (eg. an item for news). Lost or broken personal items can cause unnecessary distress.

### SHOES

As it is safer and easier to climb without shoes, we suggest the children take their shoes off for outdoor play. Please send your child in shoes that they can manage to take off and put on by themselves and are clearly labelled with their name on it.

# PREKINDERGARTEN INFORMATION

### WHAT TO BRING TO

### **PRE-KINDY**

- 1. **Red school bag** (given out at Orientation)
- 2. Wide-brim hat (see Sun Safety)
- Morning Tea pack a healthy snack (fruit, veggies, cheese, yoghurt) in a separate clearly-labelled container. Please do not include sweets/lollies/ chocolates.
  - \*We are an allergy-aware school so please refrain from including nuts/nut spreads (see Allergy Awareness).
- Lunch pack some healthy lunch items (sandwiches, crackers, cold meats, veggie sticks/salad, yoghurt, cereal bars, fruit) in a separate clearly-labelled container. Please do not include sweets/lollies/chocolates.
  - \*We are an allergy-aware school so please refrain from including nuts/nut spreads (see Allergy Awareness).
- Insulated lunch bag please provide an insulated bag or an ice brick/pack to contain their lunch.
- 6. **Drink bottle** clearly-labelled bottle with fresh water.
- Change of clothing clearly-labelled change of clothes and underwear in a ziplock plastic bag. This can remain in your child's bag until required.

### CLOTHING

Children need to wear casual and comfortable play clothes that can get wet or dirty and allow them to participate fully in all activities. Clothes should also be easy to manage for toileting. Please supply clearly-labelled change of clothes and underwear in a ziplock bag in their bag.

Note: We strongly advise that your child is toilet-trained before joining our program. However, if this is not possible, your child must wear pull-ups. Please send in extra pull-ups to each session.

## PRE-KINDY DAILY ROUTINE

At the commencement of each session, all children will be welcomed at the door. Before entering, please assist your child in placing their bag on the assigned bag area located outside the classroom. Children are encouraged to come into the classroom and feel free to choose where they would like to play.

It is important that each child feels happy and comfortable in the Pre-Kindy environment. Please feel free to stay with your child as long as they need you. The teachers will work closely with parents/carers to ensure that your child is given the best chance to settle at their own pace.

We have a flexible timetable with learning indoors and outdoors and mealtimes in between. If you have any questions or queries, please approach your child's teacher.

- 2. **Green homework satchel** clearly labelled (available from the Uniform Shop)
- 3. Wide-brim hat (see Sun Safety)
- Morning Tea pack a healthy snack (fruit, veggies, cheese, yoghurt) in a separate clearly-labelled container. Please do not include sweets/lollies/ chocolates.
  - \*We are an allergy-aware school so please refrain from including nuts/nut spreads (see Allergy Awareness).
- Lunch pack some healthy lunch items (sandwiches, crackers, cold meats, veggie sticks/salad, yoghurt, cereal bars, fruit) in a separate clearlylabelled container. Please do not include sweets/lollies/chocolates.
